The Roundtable organizes events during American Indian and Alaska Native Heritage Month in the Washington, DC metro area. April Hale is also a member of the Native American Journalist Association. April Hale is a citizen of the Navajo Nation from Iyanbito, NM. She graduated from the University of New Mexico with a degree in Communications and Journalism (2006), and from the Freedom Forum Diversity Institute's American Indian Journalism Institute at the University of South Dakota (2002).

TheCapitol.Net's Communication and Advocacy certificate gives professionals the knowledge and skills they need to effectively communicate and advocate in Washington, DC.
